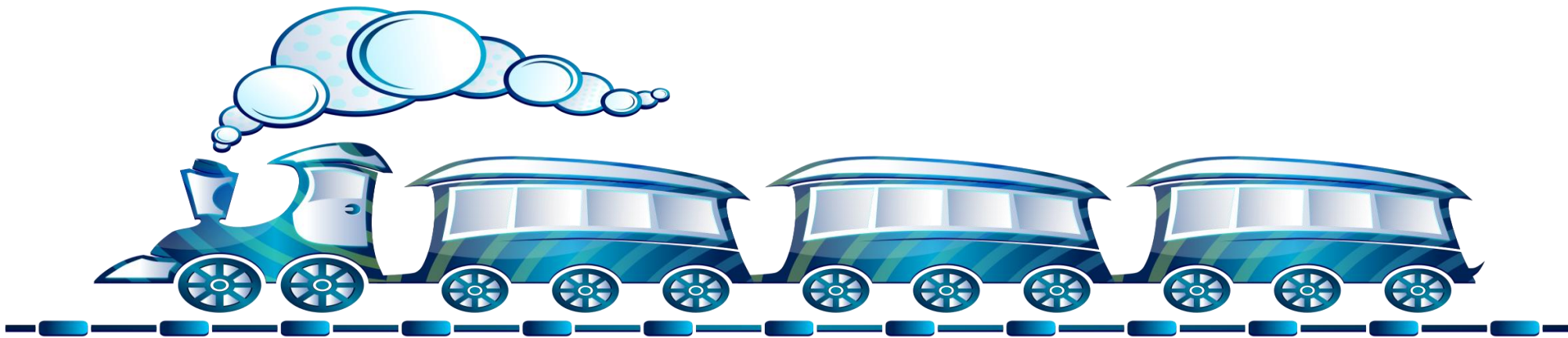


Together for Childhood is an ambitious 10 year plan to change the way everyone in one place works together.

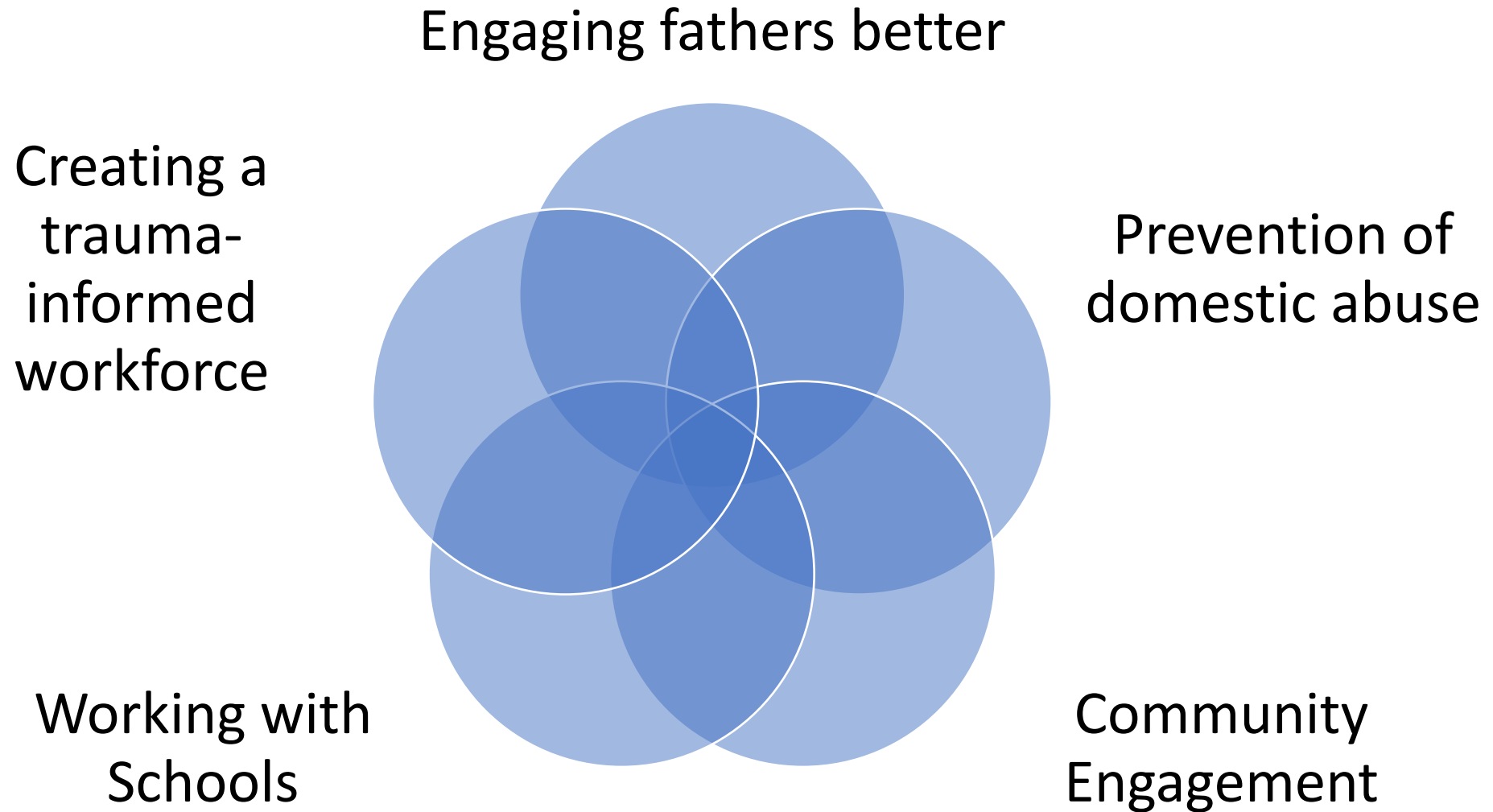

Why? Engaging Fathers Better

- Children are safer and thrive better where dads are positively engaged
- Maternal and child wellbeing are highly connected to paternal wellbeing
- Fathers are a grossly overlooked asset to families, feel marginalised yet want to be more involved
- Children are more at risk of serious abuse from men than women
- There are lots of “quick wins”
- You can’t work with the couple relationship unless your practice is already great with dads

Why? Prevention of Domestic Abuse

- Local arrangements in place for closer partnership working but with an acknowledged gap around prevention
- DA is a shared strategic priority for Humberside Police, NELC and NSPCC
- Good evidence base for prevention of Domestic Abuse
- Grimsby has acknowledged high prevalence
- What we learn about prevention of DA will help us with the trickier areas of mental health and substance misuse

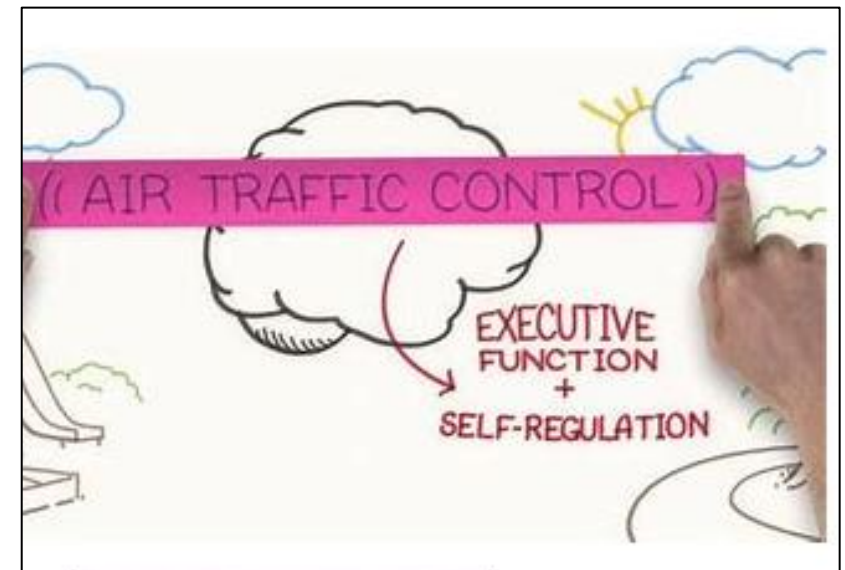
